Duration of "Five Days" and Its Impact

The concept of "Five Days" refers to short-term programs or interventions that provide immediate support and services to individuals experiencing homelessness. These programs aim to address urgent needs and bridge the gap to long-term solutions. Several programs and interventions with a five-day duration have been implemented to address homelessness effectively. Examples include Rapid Rehousing programs, which offer short-term rental assistance and support services to help individuals quickly secure permanent housing.

Homelessness in Canada

Homelessness is generally defined as the lack of stable and adequate housing, forcing individuals to reside in temporary shelters, on the streets, or in unfit living conditions. The causes of homelessness are multifaceted, encompassing structural factors such as lack of affordable housing, poverty, unemployment, mental health issues, and substance abuse.

Statistics and Trends on Homelessness in Canada

Statistics on homelessness in Canada reveal a concerning reality. According to data from the **Canadian Observatory on Homelessness** (a non-profit research institute that offers a donation platform to support their advocacy work), an estimated 235,000 individuals experience homelessness annually, with Indigenous peoples, youth, and women being particularly vulnerable. Furthermore, there has been a noticeable increase in the number of people experiencing chronic homelessness in recent years. Homelessness has severe consequences for individuals and communities. Homeless individuals face numerous challenges, including poor physical and mental health, limited access to education and employment opportunities, and social isolation. Additionally, homelessness puts a strain on public resources, healthcare systems, and community well-being.


Activities



East Algoma OPP welcome 'victim specialist' at Elliot Lake detachment

Julia Manuel was formerly director of the Waterloo Region Sexual Assault/
Domestic Violence Treatment Centre.



The mission of the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) Victim Specialist Program is to ensure victims involved with investigations by the OPP have access to the rights and assistance to which they are entitled under the law.

Responsibilities focus on serving victims in the traumatic aftermath of victimization by providing essential information on their role in the criminal justice/investigative process, including a victim's rights to information, case status information, resource information and identification of their needs.

By understanding needs surrounding communication/ understanding, safety, and religious/cultural practices, the OPP can ensure proper resources and supports are available; this also ensures a victim-centred approach is established and observed throughout the investigative process.

If a victim/survivor indicates specific supports/ accommodations are required, the VNA will trigger a referral to a Victim Specialist to provide further assistance throughout the investigative process.

The Canadian Dental Care Plan (CDCP) will help ease financial barriers to accessing oral health care for eligible Canadian residents with an annual adjusted family net income of less than \$90,000 who do not have access to dental insurance.

Eligibility criteria

To qualify for the CDCP, you must:

- not have access to dental insurance:
- Not having access to dental insurance is defined as:
- no dental insurance through your employer or a family member's employer benefits, including health and wellness accounts;
- no dental insurance through your pension (previous employer) or a family member's pension benefits; or
- no dental insurance purchased by yourself or by a family member or through a group plan from an insurance or benefits company.
- have an adjusted family net income of less than \$90,000
- □ be a Canadian resident for tax purposes
- □ have filed your tax return in the previous year


